Humanity's journey on Earth inevitably passes through the body. There is no authentic sustainability that does not start from health: that of citizens, of workers, of the ecosystems that nourish and clothe us. Italy, which has made quality of life an art, today faces a challenge that ties into a single thread what we breathe, what we eat and what we wear. Microplastics in textiles, PFAS in groundwater, chemical residues in agri-food chains are not separate emergencies: they are the symptom of a production model that has forgotten the body. The One Health approach, which unites human, animal and environmental health in an integrated vision, is not an academic theory: it is the compass that can steer Italian industry towards a truly clean supply chain, where transparency is not a regulatory obligation but a choice of civilisation.

Make the Difference: the cycle closes, matter returns.



Not just the voice of an institution, but the choral echo of dozens upon dozens of Mayors who are turning European ERDF funds into concrete action, giving back to their territories a promise of civilisation: that of a waste cycle ever closer to European targets.

The Lazio Region has approved the new 2026-2031 regional Plan, with the innovation - awaited for over 10 years - of closing the cycle, providing for complete self-sufficiency in the treatment and disposal of urban waste. The pivot of this closing of the cycle is separate waste collection across the region's 378 Municipalities.

The Plan aims to reach a regional average of separate collection of around 73% by 2031, while simultaneously reducing landfill disposal to no more than 6% of the urban waste produced.

For these objectives to materialise there is obviously a need for the essential collaboration of all citizens, starting from the first and most important phase: the correct disposal of waste in street containers or in Municipal Collection Centres (CCR). The basis of any good treatment at the plant is simple and precise disposal. Through communication campaigns and educational activities in schools, the Lazio Region aims to raise awareness among adults and young people of an ever more careful practice in sorting those "discards" that, by their very nature and composition, enjoy a promising second life.

Separate collection is not only a matter of coloured bins in residential courtyards; it becomes an industrial policy, an axis of development, a way to keep within the territory the value of the matter that the territory produces and consumes. If the cycle closes, matter returns.

From present to future — a 2026-2031 Regional Plan aligned with European directives with a single objective: regional self-sufficiency for closing the waste cycle.

The Return to the Source: Ecological Transition and Territorial Identity

The journey is complete. The human being who has thought, created, built, cultivated and exported turns back to look at the rivers, the forests, the waters that made it all possible. On World Environment Day, from Trajan's Markets, Italy proclaims its vision: a just ecological transition, free of fanaticism, grounded in science and culture, not ideology. The common thread is water: from the rivers that feed the manufacturing of the North to the springs that irrigate the South, all the way to the Mediterranean, our liquid identity. As Europe accelerates — from the WEEE Directive to Ecodesign, from the Right to Repair to Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence — Italy can claim a truth that belongs to it: the circular economy is not an invention of Brussels; it is the Italian culture of "nothing is thrown away", of mending, of reuse, of matter that transforms itself. In Prato, the rag-workers have regenerated wool since the Middle Ages, seven centuries before Europe wrote "circularity" into a regulation. The country that invented the restoration and reuse of fibre is the country naturally predisposed to lead circularity in Europe.

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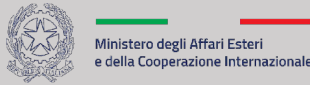
